THE FESTIVAL

One of the keys to the St David's Time Cricket Festival is that it gets played totally in the right spirit. Sure, every team and every player needs to learn how to win – but we are not actually too worried about who really wins and who loses at the Festival, and so we have specifically chosen to have no winning team. We are to be honest more interested in the concept that players need to first learn to 'risk and to possibly lose a match' – in order to 'potentially win that same time cricket match'. This concept is unique and very foreign to most youngsters these days – as they are all simply brought up on only limited overs cricket and hardly any 'time cricket matches'. As such, we kindly ask all competing teams, coaches, and even parents to buy into the above concept and to ensure that the spirit of the Festival is first and foremost on everybody's mind...



Further to the above, one of the main reasons we hold a 'Time Cricket Festival' is so that we can allow:

- A 'Batsman' to be able to learn to bat for long period and to be able to score big runs...
- A 'Bowler' to be able to bowl longer and unlimited spells – thus being able to learn to 'work' a batsman out...
- A 'Fielder' to be able to acclimatise their 'off season' legs so as to be able to stand for longer hours 'in season'...
- A 'Captain' to be able to think strategically and tactically with no fielding restrictions...
- A 'Player' to be able to feel what it takes to play time cricket and to have to get up each morning and go out there and to perform again and again...
- A 'Coach' to be able to really see how ready his players are and how his players manage mentally over an extended period of time...
- A 'Team' to be able to get in some quality pre-season middle time and net/training time during actual play whilst building a great team spirit...

AIM AND SPIRIT OF THE FESTIVAL:

In a nutshell the main aim of the Time Cricket Festival is a PRE-SEASON festival which is there to allow our players the opportunity to gain experience what time cricket" is really all about... It is about strategy and tactics, it is about being prepared to lose in order to win, and it is about breeding young captains and allowing batsmen and bowlers to spend more time in the middle. We ask that Coaches and Managers understand that we encourage some really tough and ruthless cricket – but remembering to always play the game in the appropriate spirit whilst always respecting one's opposition and putting the game first. Lastly, we encourage teams to play it hard in the middle – but knowing full well that there is absolutely no reason to cross any line.

KEY PLAYING CONDITIONS:

OVERALL CONDITIONS:

All matches will be played in accordance with the ICC Test Match playing conditions, other than any changes to such as per below.

LENGTH OF MATCHES:

Matches will all be 2 Day matches.

PLAYERS IN A TEAM:

Teams will be permitted to play 12 players per match, with only 11 batsmen allowed per innings. The 12 are to be declared at the toss in writing. If teams playing against each other mutually agree to rotate and play 13 with still ONLY 11 batsmen per innings, that will be between them.

FIELDERS AND BOWLERS:

Teams will be permitted to rotate fielders from within the 12 players or from out of as and when they desire, so as to be able to manage players workloads and to get any off field skills or training work done. Only players in the actual 12 will be permitted to bowl unless there is an injury, or it is agreed to between the teams.

OVERS:

There shall be a minimum 110 overs bowled in a day.

- All 110 overs must be bowled per day, meaning that if at the close of play there are still overs to be bowled – the bowling team must continue until the overs are completed bearing in mind any bad light which the Umpires shall call. If at the close of play once bad light has been called and the bowling team have not completed their overs – those overs will be lost for the day, and they cannot be made up.
- There shall be no 'last hour of play with so many overs' to be bowled, as all 105 overs will need to be bowled – or time will need to be played out as per the times of the game below.
- There shall be 3 overs deducted per change of innings, with a 'round down' of overs if the last wicket is taken in the middle of an over.





MATCH FORMAT & PLAYING CONDITIONS

THE TOSS AND DECLARATIONS:

- If a team wins the toss and chooses to bat first – each team has the right to bat for 65 overs before a compulsory declaration of the 1st innings.
- If a team wins the toss and chooses to bowl first – the batting team can bat for 70 overs before a compulsory declaration, whilst the bowling team will then get 60 overs to bat before they have to declare their 1st innings.
- The new ball shall be available to each team after every 50 overs.
- The follow-on score will be 100 runs.

BREAKS IN PLAY:

- Drinks breaks will be 5min and must be taken on the field of play.
- Lunch breaks will be 60min long, but only 40min on Day 4.
- There will be NO Tea Breaks in either of the 2 Day matches.

PLAYING CONDITIONS CONTINUED...

EARLY MATCH FINISHES:

In order to keep teams playing and on their feet for pre-season preparations, there will be some unique scenarios which will kick in if matches end earlier than the full 2 days as follows:

- If a match ends any time before lunch on Day 2, then a brand new shorter 'time game' will simply restart. The winning team will bat first to set a target – with a clear intention of trying to get a win out of the game. In order to win this match, the team bowling second will need just '4' wickets in the 2nd innings to win the match – whilst the team batting second can chase the declaration score down to win.
- If a match ends on Day 2 after lunch but before 15h15 (and 13h30 on the last day of festival due to different times), the amount of overs left in the day shall be taken and multiplied by 4,5 runs so as to create a target for one of the teams to chase on the last afternoon. The winning team of this match may choose if they wish to chase or to defend that set target – knowing that the bowling team will only need 4 wickets to bowl the chasing team out and to thus win the match.
- If a match ends after 16h00 on Day 2 (and 14h30 on last day of festival due to different times) – there shall be no further cricket played in the match.

AWARDS:


There will be:

- 'A Batsman of the Festival'
- 'A Bowler of the Festival'
- 'A Player of the Festival'

NOTE: Mr Brad Ireland (St David's Director of Sport) and Mr Theo Garrun (Festival Media Specialist and Reporter) will manage these award decisions, and he will consult with teams as he sees fit. Their final award decisions will be final.

In closing, there shall be a Festival Director (Dave Nosworthy) who will oversee the Festival's playing conditions and the various match scenarios with the Umpires – whilst overseeing play and the 'Spirit of the Festival' at all times.



FASKEN PLAYER OF THE DAY – THE PURPLE CAP

- At the close of play each day, each team will have one of their players presented with a Fasken Time Cricket Festival 'Player of the Day' cap.
- Each team captain shall present a 'purple cap' to the opposition player who they think was the best player on the day. The two caps will be presented immediately after the day's play when the two teams gather together on the side of the field, for each of their captains to shake hands and to make their awards to their chosen opposition 'Player of the Day'.
- The 'purple cap' can be kept by the winning players as a memento – but it is also to be worn in all on field and off field activities the following day instead of the player's traditional school cap.




