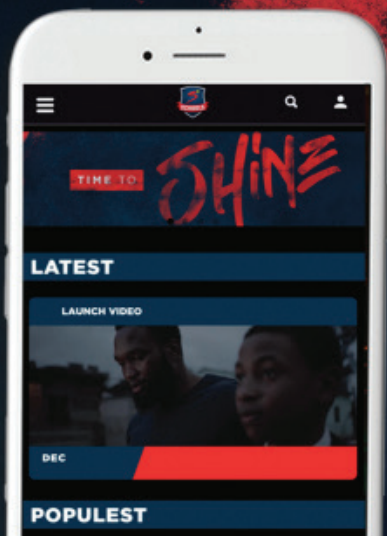

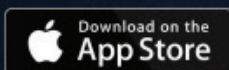

Tournament Rules 2025



1. The matches will be played as per the FIFA Laws of the Game, subject to the tournament rules listed below.
2. The U19 tournament will initially be played on a round-robin basis, with points being allocated as follows:
 - 3 points for a win
 - 1 point for a draw
 - 0 points for a loss
3. The U15 festival will also initially be played on a round-robin basis. In the second half of the festival new pools will be created so that similar strength teams will be matched against one another.
4. In the event of two or more teams finishing on the same number of points after the round-robin stage, then the team with the better goal difference will advance, if still tied then the team scoring the most goals, then the team with more head-to-head points. In the event of the teams still being level, the result will be decided by a random draw.
5. The u19 matches will consist of two halves of **35** minutes each, with an interval of 5 minutes between halves.

The u15 matches will consist of two halves of **25** minutes each, with an interval of 5 minutes between halves.
6. No extra time will be played. In the event of there being a draw during the play-off stage of the u19 tournament, there will be a penalty shootout as per FIFA laws.
7. Red cards. **This rule applies for the duration of the tournament.**

Players swearing on the field will be issued a red card.

Any player who receives a red card will face an automatic one match ban.
8. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to suspend any player, coach, or team, from the Tournament for unruly conduct.
9. A team will consist of no more than 18 players, with seven players being allowed to be substituted during a match. All boys must be currently registered in a full-time capacity at your respective High School. U15 players must be born in 2010 or later. U19 players must be born in 2006 or later. Boys may only play for ONE team throughout the tournament.
10. It is mandatory that all team lists be submitted at the managers' meeting.
11. Coaches and substitutes are to remain in the technical area during the match. Only the substitutes and the coaching staff for that team are allowed in the technical area. Please ensure that parents, other players, supporters, etc do not encroach on the technical area.
12. The team listed second on the match schedule is deemed to be the AWAY team, and is responsible for changing into an alternative match strip if there is a clash. Teams are responsible for providing their own alternative strip. The organisers will not provide bibs.

Tournament Rules cont.

13. **In the U19 tournament, rolling substitution is not in place.** A substituted player may not return to play in that match once he has been substituted. Substituted players must leave the field of play at the nearest point on the boundary line. The substitutes must wear bibs. Each school to supply their own bibs. Substitutions made purely to waste time in the last minutes of games are strongly discouraged - this is against the spirit of the tournament.

In the U15 festival, rolling substitution is in place. The substitutes must wear bibs. Each school to supply their own bibs. The substitutes must enter the field at the halfway line only after the substituted players have left the field. The fourth official will supervise this transition.

14. Captains are to spin 5 minutes before the scheduled start of their match.
15. Teams arriving late: if a team arrives late it will start with a 1 goal deficit. If a team is not ready to play 5 minutes after the scheduled start time, it will forfeit the game with 3 goals being awarded to the opposition. A minimum of seven players constitutes a team.
16. Centralised timing will be used. Consequently, time wasting tactics, particularly excessive celebrations after a goal is scored, are not allowed - this is against the spirit of the tournament.
17. External neutral referees will be taking on the responsibility of officiating.
18. No video referrals or post-match protests using any obtainable video footage will be allowed.
19. The u19 teams finishing in the top three positions must be present at the awards ceremony.
20. Lightning interruptions (or other unforeseen interruptions).

A warning siren is automatically triggered in the event of a lightning strike within 10km of the school, and all outside activity must cease and safe shelter sought. Play may only resume once the all-clear has sounded.

- any match that has reached half-time when the interruption occurs will be deemed complete, and the score at the time of the interruption will be the final score.
 - If the interruption occurs before half time, the match will continue once play is allowed to resume, but under the revised playing times.
21. Match schedule. The tournament committee has the right to amend the match schedule in the case of unforeseen circumstances. The objective is to provide six matches for each team, although the match duration may be shortened.
22. The tournament committee also decides on all matters that are not stated in the rules. The committee's decisions are binding.
