Tigers and Rangers shone on day one

he Cricket Company St Savid's T10 tournament got underway on Saturday, with the seven teams playing three games each in an intense day of cricket.

At the end of it two teams, Temba Bavuma Tigers and Rivonia Rangers, came away with three wins out of three.

The Tigers beat St Stithians Supermen by 10runs; Montrose Meteors by 2 runs and St David's Dynamite by 4 runs. Their Mbulelo Mtimkulu was not out twice – 32 not out vs St Stithians Supermen and 46 not out against Montrose Meteors.

Riccardo Scarola of the Rivonia Rangers was the top run-scorer of the day. He also got the only century – 105 vs St David's Dynamite. Rivonia made the two biggest team totals of the day: 155/3 against St David's Dynamite and 120/0 in chasing down the target set by Montrose Meteors.

Other batsmen to shine were Matthew Knoop of St Stithians, who totalled 135 runs, and Tristan Osborne of Rivonia Rangers, who got 128 in his three games.

Day three of the Inanda Hoops sees the quarterfinals and semifinals contested

big tournament like the Fasken Inanda Hoops Challenge is characterised by frenetic action in its first two days with the teams involved in preliminary pool games, limited rest in between matches and confusion about where they stand and what they have to do to make the quarterfinals.

By the third day that's all over. The quarterfinalists have been indentified and, for the title-contenders, it all becomes more focused. For the rest, it becomes about pride and playing for as high a position in the final classification as is possible.

Saturday dawned with all of last year's top-placed teams pretty much through to the quarter-final stage.

There was, however, a big change in the schools topping the preliminary pool tables in the U18 section.

Parktown, The King's School Linbro Park and Michael Mount won their pools, and none of them were top four finishers in 2024. The defending champions, St Stithians, didn't make the quarterfinals this time around.

Last year's runners-up in the U15 section, St Alban's, weren't in the quarterfinals, but the rest of last year's semi-finalists were all there, including the defending champions, St David's Marist Inanda.

The semis are scheduled for later in the afternoon. The finals are on Sunday at 11.30am and 1pm.
