

ST DAVID'S MARIST INANDA MATRIC 2020 RESULTS BREAKDOWN

We are exceptionally proud of the results achieved by our matric class of 2020 in the IEB NSC examinations, and celebrate their academic excellence and personal character. We achieved a 100% pass rate, with a 97% bachelor degree pass rate.

OVERVIEW

- Our top achievers this year attained exceptional results:
 - 4 boys achieved 8 distinctions
 - 2 boys achieved 7 distinctions
 - 2 boys achieved 6 distinctions
 - 11 boys achieved 5 distinctions
 - 6 boys achieved 4 distinctions
 - 9 boys achieved 3 distinctions
 - 12 boys achieved 2 distinctions
 - 33 boys achieved 1 distinction
- Two thirds of the class achieved at least one distinction spread across the wide range of our subject offerings a sign of boys achieving in their areas of passion.
- Our two top achievers, Luke Lawson and Nicholas Carr attained a 94,7% and 93,4% average respectively, both achieving 99% for Mathematics.
 - Both boys ranked as IEB Outstanding Achievers, having achieved within the top 5% in 6 or more Subjects and achieving a rating level of 7 in Life Orientation.
- Nine boys ranked in the top 1% of Candidates across a range of subjects

- A collective 222 distinctions were achieved across 22 subjects by 121 full-time students
- Notable distinction rates were achieved in Accounting (24%), Business Studies (33%), Dramatic Arts (50%), Economics (100%), Geography (28%), German (100%), History (48%), Information Technology (28%), isiZulu (28%), Life Orientation (22%), Life Sciences (24%), Mathematical Literacy (68%), Mathematics (37%) and Physical Sciences (20%).
- Once again, with few exceptions, our subject averages exceeded the IEB averages with Accounting (+6%), Business Studies (+6%), Economics (+30%), German (+13%), Geography (+9%), History (+7%), Life Sciences (+9%), Mathematical Literacy (+10%), Mathematics (+9%) and Physical Sciences (+5%) higher than the national averages, while Afrikaans, Dramatic Arts, English and French also all exceeded the IEB averages.
